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We were all super tired at the end of Space Camp as most of us didn't get much sleep, but it was one of the best days of our lives!"

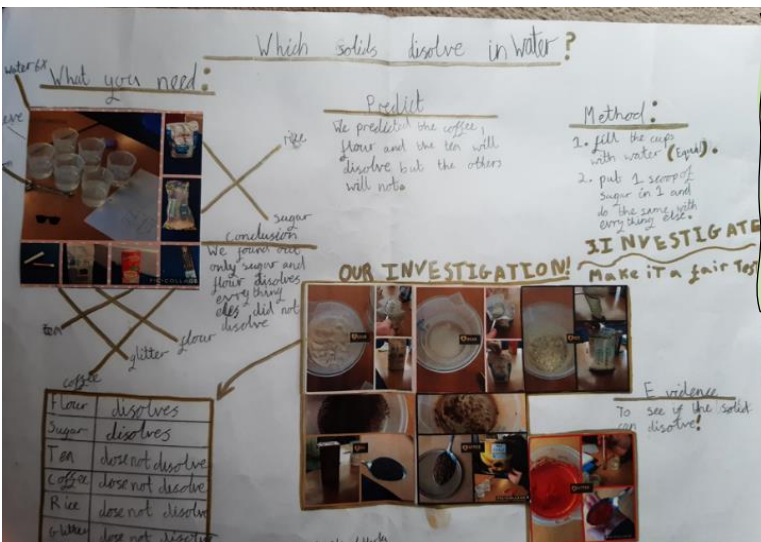
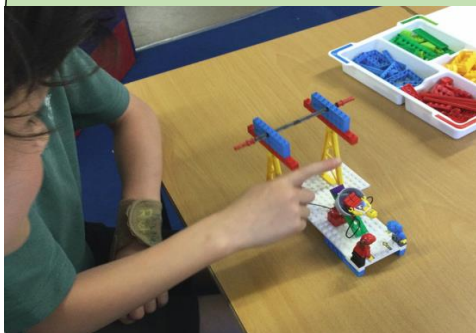


9 out of 10 schools in partnership held their own Space Camp during the year 2022/2023
